1:3 "went down to Joppa" "went down into it" [the ship] 1:5 "gone down into inner part of ship" "lain down" fell "fast asleep" 1:7 The sailors "cast [down] lots" "the lot fell [down] on Jonah" 1:15 The sailors "hurled him [down] into the sea" 2:3 "you cast me into the deep" [on the surface of the water] 2:5a "waters closed [down] over me [in midst of the sea] 2:5d "at the roots of the mountains" [the sea bottom] 2:6 "down to land whose bars closed upon me forever" "the pit" [Jonah is in "Sheol," the lowest point he could
